National Summit of Community Networks in Kenya **Theme: “Role of Community Networks in developing Kenya’s Digital Economy”**

The Internet Society Kenya Chapter is convening the inaugural National Summit of Community Networks in Kenya to promote a sustainable, safe, and open community-centered connectivity for all Kenyans. The Summit will be co-hosted by AHERI Community Network, which operates community networks within Kisumu, Siaya and Homabay counties of Kenya. AHERI Community Network is also one of the pioneer Community Networks in the country. The summit is being convened under the auspices of the Association of Community Networks in Kenya which brings together Community Networks from different parts of the country.

The summit will include community network operators, policymakers, regulators, donors, and other stakeholders to share experiences, learn from one another, and discuss ways to support and promote community networks in Kenya. The chapter hopes the summit will result in more cooperation and backing for community networks, which can be crucial in closing the digital divide and fostering access to ICTs in underserved areas. Partnerships between community network operators, civil society organizations, and governmental organizations can help achieve this by encouraging knowledge sharing and capacity building. In Kenya, financial assistance and incentives can be offered to encourage the growth and expansion of community networks. Community networks are decentralized, community-owned, and community-operated communication infrastructures that provide accessible, dependable, and locally relevant connections. Insights into community networks, their benefits, and legal and policy frameworks are needed to support their growth and sustainability. Stakeholder collaboration is needed to promote and support the growth of community networks.

Objectives:

The objectives of the summit will be:

- Increase awareness of community networks in Kenya by sharing experiences and practices on deployment, management, and sustainability in Kenya.
- Promote collaboration and partnerships between network operators, decision-makers, regulators, and other stakeholders to foster and strengthen community networks in Kenya.
- Engage with policymakers, regulators, and other stakeholders to advocate for policies and regulations that support community networks in Kenya.

Outcomes:

- Increased awareness and understanding of community networks among policymakers, regulators, and other stakeholders in Kenya.
- Enhanced collaboration and partnerships among community network operators, policymakers, regulators, and other stakeholders.
- Agreed collective roadmap for promoting Kenyan community networks.
- Increased investment in community networks by private sector players and donors.
- Strengthened community networks in underserved areas of Kenya.

Participants:

The summit will bring together community network operators, policymakers, regulators, funders, civil society organizations, academia, and the private sector from Kenya, Africa and the world. It will be a hybrid event with both physical and virtual participation.
